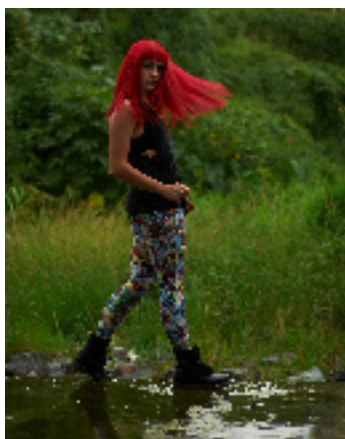
RAW Dance Company
